



ARE YOU PREPARED?

Kentuckians have experienced firsthand how natural disasters can occur at any time and often with little warning. Disasters take many forms, and we can feel their impacts across most areas of family life. The In the Face of Disaster series will cover the topics below in a 5-part, monthly series in order to educate community members on the importance of disaster preparedness while exploring topics from family and home considerations to how to navigate trauma post-disaster. Attendees will gain knowledge of how to develop their own disaster preparedness plans so that they are ready in the face of a disaster.



Brussels Sprouts Gratin

2 pounds (4 cups) Brussels sprouts

- 6 slices turkey bacon
- 2 medium onions, diced 3 tablespoons butter 3 tablespoons flour
- 1/2 cup low sodium chicken broth
- 1 1/2 cups skim milk
- 1 cup shredded Parmesan cheese (packed)
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon black pepper

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Wash Brussels sprouts and remove the outer leaves. Using a paring knife, score the core end of each sprout. In a large saucepan over medium-high heat, boil sprouts 3-5 minutes or until just tender. In a skillet over medium heat, cook turkey bacon until crisp. Remove from pan. Add the onions to the pan and cook until tender, about 5 minutes. Remove from pan. Melt butter in skillet. Add flour and stir until smooth. Using a whisk, slowly add chicken broth and milk. Stir until thick and smooth. Add cheese and stir until smooth. Add bacon and onions. Season with salt and pepper. Coat a 9-by-13 inch pan with non-stick spray. Place Brussels sprouts in pan and pour the gratin sauce over the top. Bake 25 minutes or until the top is lightly

Yield: 8, 1/2 cup servings

Nutritional Analysis: 170 calories, 6 g fat, 2.5 g saturated fat, 0 g trans fat, 20 mg cholesterol, 660 mg sodium, 20 g carbohydrate, 5 g fiber, 7 g sugars, 11 g protein.
